

Permission form for interviews

[For unpublished interviews from which you're quoting a named, living person.]

If the person has died, if you paraphrase (more than a word-for-word translation), if you don't identify the person (and it isn't readily apparent to anyone in the know who the person really is), you generally don't need written permission to use an unpublished interview. If there is any chance that what you quote from a deceased person would be considered controversial enough to cause unwarranted distress to the surviving family, think carefully about whether there is a kinder way to make your point.

Make three copies of this form and ask the person you've interviewed to sign and date all three copies. Leave one copy with the person interviewed, keep one copy for your own files, and send one copy to your publisher when asked to do so.
