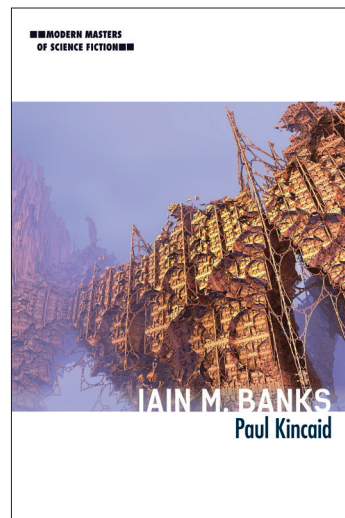

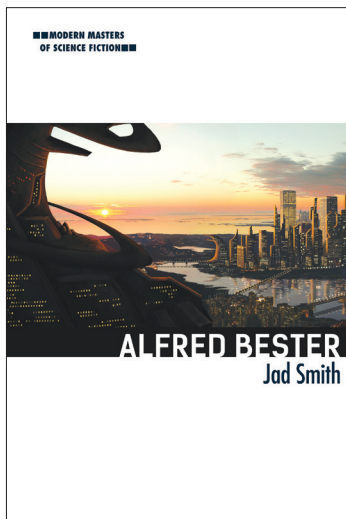

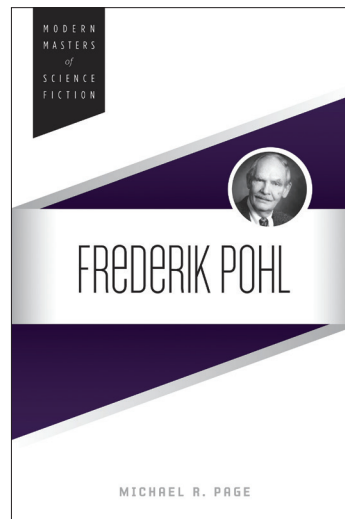
Alfred Bester
